Voluntary Participation and Withdrawal from the Study

Participation in the study is completely voluntary. Your consent to participate may be withdrawn at any time prior to completion of the survey and without any reason. If you

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withdraw prior to completing and submitting the survey online, your data will not be recorded and any demographic data you have provided will be destroyed. However, once you have submitted your online survey, you will not be able to withdraw your data.

Your privacy

This is an anonymous survey. Your participation in this study and any information you provide will be treated in a confidential manner. The data will be kept in line with the WA University Sector Disposal Authority (WAUSDA) in a non-identifiable format, in a password protected computer or a secure server." The WAUSDA Guidelines 14.6.5 Conducting Research does not set a minimum retention period. Conducting research with outcomes that are classed as minor, not covered by other minor research classes are required to be retained for a minimum of 7 years after date of publication, or 7 years after conclusion of the project, whichever is later, then destroyed.

How the results and data will be stored?

The data will be stored using the UWA Institutional Research Data Store (IRDS) in a deidentified format, in a password protected computer or a secure server, for minimum seven years. Data will be destroyed seven years after the completion of the study or after the results have been published. Identifying information and participant records will remain strictly confidential. Personal data will not leave the experimental database in a form that allows participants to be identified. The results of this research will be made available through conferences or professional scientific journals. Your rights under any applicable data protection laws are not affected.
